Good discipline in the school is expected to create an atmosphere where each student feels secure and is taught to accept responsibility for her actions.

In co-operation with parents, and in the spirit of Nano Nagle, the school is committed to working to build a sense of pride in the school, and a sense of belonging and to foster respect for the whole school community. As a student of Presentation Secondary School, Wexford you are required to be:

- Committed to your study
- > Respectful of the rights of other students to learn and of teachers to teach

All students, parents, teachers and staff have the right to feel safe in their school. Our school promotes responsibility, respect, good manners and academic excellence in a safe, caring and effective learning environment.

The school, therefore, has the following expectations of all of its Parents/Guardians, Staff and Students.

#### Parents/ Guardians

The responsibility of parents/guardians includes understanding and supporting the Code of Behaviour and being respectful of all in the school community. It is expected that parents will develop a good working relationship with the school. #### Staff

All staff members are expected to understand and support the Code of Behaviour and to promote and develop respectful relationships with all members of the school community.

Teachers will be committed to the highest standards of professional service in their teaching and understand that their primary professional obligation is to their students. Teachers are expected to be familiar with and work within the terms of the Code of Professional Practice and Code of Professional Conduct as set out by the Teaching Council.

### **VSware Positive Behaviour System**

- ❖ Our school rewards system is designed to motivate students by recognising the great things they do. Students are awarded praise points online, making things a lot quicker and easier than the traditional paper-based school reward systems
- Reward systems are an effective way in which you can celebrate student achievement and positive student behaviour.
- The use of rewards within the classroom are a form of extrinsic motivation for students, encouraging them to participate cooperatively in academic and social learning experiences.
- ❖ However, it is important to recognise that these rewards systems should be consistent and fair, providing students with motivation and encouragement
- Our School reward systems is where students are awarded points or commendations for doing something well. This might be for working really hard on a piece of work or based on something like extra-curricular involvement, attendance, grades or sticking to the school rules.
- Students are rewarded in some way based on how many points they have received.
- Every student starts with 100 points points can be added or deducted.
- ❖ Every time a student receives 15 points they will receive a Well Done Card if they receive three Well Done Cards they will receive a prize.
- Points can also be deducted for various reasons the usual School Sanctions are still in place
   such as Detentions, In-School Suspensions & Out-School Suspensions.
- Vsware Behaviour System is an add on to promote Positive Behaviour Management and Positive Reinforcement.
- ❖ Parents & guardians have access to our online system and can monitor where their daughter is at, under the behaviour tab.
- An Assistant Principal is responsible for monitoring and tracking of the year groups.
- Civic Spirit Awards are given to students at our End of Year Awards, to those students who have gained the most points on the system. As well as this a Class Spirit Award is given to the First Year Class who have accumulated the most points.

#### SERIOUS AND/OR PERSISTENT MISBEHAVIOUR AND/OR BULLYING

Students who seriously and/or persistently misbehave or bully will be referred to the Board Of Management which has available to it sanctions up to and including expulsion. These sanctions will be imposed as per the school's Policy on Suspension and Expulsion which is available on request.

#### ESSENTIALS OF SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Official bottle green <u>knee length</u> skirt or official school trousers two recommended. Uniform should be bought to allow for growth in the future.
- V-neck bottle green jumper with school crest two recommended.
- Two white shirts with collar and revere for seniors / Two Honey Gold shirts with collar and revere for juniors. Bottle green socks or black socks or plain black tights only.
- A green school jacket or green school fleece.
- A pair of <u>flat black or brown school shoes</u> no boots and no high or platform shoes allowed. No canvas or pumps allowed.
- Red school scarf only. No other colours or patterns permitted.
- White apron for Home Economics students.
- Care of the uniform is important and it needs to be maintained. Read care labels carefully.
- Students should put their names on the labels of all items including PE uniform and School Coat.

#### P.E. Classes

All students are expected to come with their gear and participate fully in P.E. class each week. If, as a result of illness or injury, a student is unable to participate then she must have a relevant signed note in her journal from her parent/guardian. Persistent or ongoing illness will require a doctor's certificate.

First incident: Recorded on Vsware

Second incident: Recorded on Vsware & PE related task.
Third incident: Recorded on Vsware, sanction Detention.

#### P.E. UNIFORM

- Navy track-suit bottoms. No stripes allowed.
- School Sports Top with crest
- School Half-Zip with Crest
- Securely fastened sports runners and sports socks. Canvas shoes are not allowed.
- Sports shorts optional for warmer days red, navy or white only.
- The Half-Zip does not constitute a replacement for school jumper or school coat. Unless advised by teacher for school trip, school workshops or sport related activity.
- Students who have PE either first class or last two classes can come to school in PE uniform or go home in PE Uniform.

NOTE: In the interest of safety no jewellery may be worn during P.E. classes.

#### **DETENTION PROCEDURES**

In the interest of fairness to all students the following procedures apply.

- Parents/guardians will be contacted by post when a student is given detention.
- The student must attend detention on the date stated on the letter.
- If a student fails to turn up for her detention then she will attend detention the following week.
- If the student fails to turn up for that detention then she will be **suspended**.
- Detentions will be held weekly and Parent/Guardians will be notified by post. It will also go on Vsware.

<u>NOTE:</u> If a student is absent on the day of her detention, then her detention will be transferred to another day.

#### **SUPERVISION OF STUDENTS**

- The school building and grounds are supervised for 30 minutes before school starts and for 15 minutes after school finishes.
- Due to Insurance reasons the school will close to all student's from 4.15pm every day, with exception of those doing Supervised Study, or involved in any Extra-Curricular activities.
- Room 3 will remain open from 3.50pm (Mon) and 3.30pm (Tues-Fri) until 4.15pm for student's to stay until collected. Room 3 is NOT an Unsupervised Study room, it is a waiting area only. Until 4.15pm.
- Supervised study is available after school. In the assigned study hall, school closes to all students except those doing Supervised Study or involved in extra-curricular activities at 4.15pm.
