I would like to commend our 6th year students in the way they have carried themselves over the last 5 or 6 years, but, also during the last couple of weeks. We have all been waiting for a decision to be made with regard the Leaving Certificate class of 2020, eventually this decision was made, while many will welcome the decision some may be upset and experiencing a new anxiety and stress, which is totally understandable.

We have tried our best to provide as much clarity to students & our staff as we can at this time. We will work through the process as outlined above over the coming weeks and have no doubt that students will be rewarded for the work they have put in over the past few years in preparation for the Leaving Cert exams.

In general terms, our approach will be guided by the maxim that it is better to be right, than to be first. I firmly believe we need to get this process right and we will do our utmost to make sure that all are treated fairly, transparently & all are treated in an equitable manner. I will not be rushing out of the starting blocks to be the first school to complete the process. Slow & steady to make sure the process is done correctly. We know from the document what we must do as a school to determine Calculated Grades.

On a more serious note and I mentioned this to the students at assembly yesterday, which is in relation to canvassing. That Parents/Guardians or students who seek to influence the Leaving Cert grade awarded will be reported to the DES. Any canvassing or emails or phone-calls of such activity will be reported to me straightaway & it is under my remit to inform the authorities of any such canvassing,

A very important point of information for all involved in this process, Students, Parents/Guardians, & teachers that it is ultimately the DES that determines the final grade, not the teachers or school.

We are in extremely challenging times which were fraught with uncertainty and lack of clarity. There was growing frustration, stress, and anxiety among students around the country and there was no safe way based on the advice that the Dept of Education had received to run exams safely.

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This letter will not be the last contact between students, parents, and teachers however, it is essential that there is no further engagement or correspondence between teachers, parents and students regarding grades and classwork to ensure the integrity of the process. So, teaching classes ended for 6th years yesterday the 11th May 2020.

Teachers may get in touch with their individual classes to say goodbye etc. As I mentioned to the students yesterday, we are going to have an end of year celebration online for 6th year students before the end of May. I will also hold another assembly with 6th years next week, just to keep them up to date with any new information from the DES. We are all working towards an end of school celebration and my preference is to do it in person rather than virtually as I do not want to see them on a screen for the last time. A hug, handshake, and a sharing of a cup of tea and cake is my preference. All our students at PSS, Wexford are too good to let them leave school without any form of celebration.

Hopefully, if everything is okay in September we will have our 6th Year Graduation in the normal manner in either our School Gym or one of the local churches, this all down to how the health situation will be at this time. But, for now we will celebrate in some form online.
