



Subject Options



- Students who are just beginning First-Year can be overwhelmed when they learn that they have to study so many subjects, some of which may be completely new.
- However, in our experience, students adjust quite quickly to the new challenges of second level education.
- We ask you to read the description of the subjects contained in this Information Pack
- For the optional subjects, they should also choose subjects in which they may already have an interest
- One of the great advantages of a large school, such as ours, is that we can provide a wide range of subjects.
- Students study a broad range of subjects, since it will allow them to identify their strengths and preferences before having to focus their choices in Second-Year and indeed on into Leaving Certificate.
- Please NOTE certain class sizes are limited due to timetable & staffing restrictions – Home Economics 80, Art 72, Music 72, Spanish 24, Graphics 24
- In rare cases if a student does not get e.g. Music in 1st year it does not limit them studying it in 2nd year if there are places


Tutor classes



Induction Programme for First Year Students.

- In Presentation Secondary School we are committed to the welfare of all the students in our care.
- In particular, we are committed to ensuring that each student gets the best possible start in their new school and that the transition is as easy as possible for them.







The Class Tutor

- Each class has a Class Tutor a teacher who will meet them each morning for the assembly period for 10 minutes. 20 minutes on Wednesdays
- This constant contact means that new students have a person in the school with whom they have contact each day and to whom they can talk if there is any problem with which they need help.

The Year Head

SCOL DA COCH SARMAN

- Each year group has a Year Head Teacher who has overall responsibility for the year group.
- They deal with pastoral and behaviour issues in the year and have a great deal of contact with the students.
- We also have an attendance officer with special responsibility for attendance.
- If there is any difficulty with attendance or a student requires a prolonged absence from school - the attendance officer should be informed by note.





The Meitheal mentor Scheme

- We have a student mentoring programme in Presentation Wexford where three students from sixth year meet with new first year students in small groups, at lunchtime, once a week for the first months of the year.
- It is an excellent opportunity for first year students to get to know some of the older students and to ask for their advice on issues.
- The small group structure of the meetings allows students to get to know other first years in a structured environment.





Students' Council.

- There is an active Student Council in the school. Each year elects two representatives who represent the students of that year group.
- These two reps are members of the student council in the school.
- The job of the council is to represent the views of the students to school management and to assist in the running of the school.







Lockers

- Each student will receive a locker in the school. Lockers will be allocated at the start of the academic year. We recommend that students leave any valuables they have in the locker.
- You will be aware, from the Behaviour Code, that mobile phones must be switched off on arrival at school.
- Students should also use the lockers as much as possible for their books as this cuts down on the considerable weight of the bags.
- Students should get into the habit of going to lockers at break times to gather the books for the classes in the next session as students are not allowed to go to lockers between classes.

Tips from First Year Parents for Incoming First Year Parents

- Most students will transfer successfully from primary school into secondary school.
- However, a little anxiety is inevitable with any change, and this is normal and to be expected.
- Remember that children and teenagers are often more resilient than we give them credit for.
- To ease the transition of primary school into secondary school, parents can keep in mind the following tips:

- 1. Try to talk through any major issues that your child may have. The most common stresses and anxieties for 1st year students involve the changes and differences between primary and secondary school.
- 2. Have your child's name on their school uniform, PE gear, jacket, bag, and all books and copies. Ensure your child has a lock for their locker.

- 3. Encourage your child to be organised. Show them what this looks like.
 - Go through their school journal with them
 - Ensure they can take down homework clearly and record when work is due
 - Have a copy of their timetable at home in their study area
 - Encourage them to keep a weekly calendar to remind them to bring their PE gear, or Home EC supplies, TG box etc
 - Encourage them to pack their bags the night before
 - Some students find that keeping all items for a subject in a clear mesh zipped folder helps to keep them organised. This also minimizes the amount of time they need to spend at their lockers.
 - Other students like to colour code their copies by subject to visually help them.




