

I know I speak for all of us in this school when I say I am confident you will find your new school community a warm and welcoming place, where you can make the most of your talents and abilities and make lots of new friends.


The entire school community looks forward to seeing you all in August 2026.

# School History

The Presentation Congregation was founded in Cork in 1775 by Nano Nagle, a daughter of one of the oldest families in the country. The aim was to help downtrodden citizens by the only means in her power – to provide them with schools and education.

The story of Presentation, Wexford, started in October 1818, when two sisters came from the already established convent in Kilkenny. They started by opening a Primary school. About 1940 a second-level school was established and in the following years the school became a fully recognized Secondary school.

The Presentation order was established in Wexford town in October 1818, being the first religious order to come to the town after the Penal Laws. In the 1820s, the Presentation Sisters established a school, which has, over time, developed into the Presentation Secondary School. We marked 200 years of providing education to the town of Wexford in 2018.



# School Profile



The school currently operates under the trusteeship of C. E. I. S. T. (Catholic Education an Irish Schools Trust). As such, it supports the Religious and Educational Philosophy of its Founder, Nano Nagle. Religious Education takes a central place in the life and curriculum of the school. We are an all-girl, voluntary secondary school and are situated in a primarily residential area of Wexford town.

Presentation School Wexford aims, with the resources available, to provide the best possible environment in which to facilitate the cultural, educational, moral, physical, religious, social, linguistic and spiritual values and traditions of all students.

Presentation Secondary School, Wexford provides for a wide range of artistic, cultural, social and sporting activities to develop the talents of all students and to provide them with the confidence to be involved in various activities in later life. The school also places great emphasis on the development of competitive games for all its students.

Working together as a school community, the Board of Management, parents, staff and students aim to provide an environment that will allow each student to develop intellectually, physically, morally, socially and spiritually so that she will be able to fulfil her role in society.





# Our Curriculum



## 01 Subject Choice

One of the great advantages of a large school, such as ours, is that we can provide a wide range of subjects. In Junior cycle students study a broad range of subjects, since it will allow them to identify their strengths and preferences before having to focus their choices in second year and indeed into Leaving Certificate.



## 02 State Examinations


The school is committed to supporting each student to achieve their potential in State Examinations. An Academic Council has been set up to oversee the change of levels for students between higher and ordinary level. It is expected that the majority of students will take examination subjects at higher level.

We expect that our pupils will achieve higher than the national average marks in all their subjects. To this end a report showing examination results achieved by Presentation Wexford pupils compared with national statistics will be prepared annually and will be reviewed by each subject department and each teacher.



## 03 Mixed Ability Classes

It is school policy to have 'mixed ability' classes in first year so as to allow students to settle into the school and to achieve their potential. Students will be banded in second year in core subjects like English, Irish and Maths on the basis of the Christmas and Summer results and on the recommendations of their teachers. At senior cycle students are streamed in 5th year for English, Irish and Maths.



## 04 Additional Educational Needs

Additional Education is available to students who meet the criteria. If any student has been assessed or receives support in Primary School, please let us know and submit any assessments to the school at your earliest convenience, so that we can have necessary supports in place.


## 05 Physical Education & Wellbeing

Our Physical Education and Wellbeing programme emphasizes the importance of physical & mental fitness, teamwork, and sportsmanship. ## 06 Guidance & Counselling

Guidance counsellors are trained professionals with the expertise and knowledge to help and support students to make important choices related to personal and social issues, educational and career issues throughout their time here. They are part of the Student Support Teams, in the school, and their aim is to encourage students to develop a range of skills to enhance their own wellbeing, to improve their learning skills and to develop their career skills.



## 07 Religious Education

In Presentation Secondary School, Wexford, Religious Education plays a central role in the curriculum offered to students. We are committed to the importance of formal religious education, as it enables us to reflect on, explore and articulate what it means to be a Presentation school and a C. E. I. S. T. school. If a parent/guardian has concerns about the religious education of their child, then these concerns must be raised through appointment with the Principal, prior to accepting the offer of a place in the school.



## 08 VSware Positive Behaviour System


Our school has an online rewards system (through the school's VSware portal) which is designed to motivate students by recognising the great things they do in-and-out of the classroom. Students are awarded points or commendations for doing something well. Every student starts with 100 points – points can be added (or deducted). Parents/guardians have access to the VSware system and can monitor where their daughter is at, under the Behaviour tab.



## 09 Exemption from Irish

Only students who have an official exemption from Irish, granted by the Department of Education and Skills, are considered to be 'exempt' from the subject. Irish is mandatory for all other students. If a student has been granted an exemption in primary school, please submit a copy of the exemption to the school on or before admittance. Students will continue to study Irish until a copy of their exemption is received by our school.





- For the optional subjects, they should also choose subjects in which they may already have an interest



# Pastoral Care



Presentation Secondary School Wexford has a Student Support Team in place that deals with students whose need for support might exceed those of other students in the school.

The Student Support Team comprises the Principal, Deputy Principal, the Guidance Counsellors, the Additional Education Needs and Learning Support Coordinators.

The Student Support Team meets each week and reviews the needs of all the students who receive extra supports in the school.

The Student Support Team having reviewed the needs of the individual student may decide to link in with the student in school but may also decide to seek extra supports outside of the school.

Year Heads, Class Tutors and Subject Teachers may raise their concerns with regard to particular students and may refer students to the Student Support Team.

Members of the Student Support Team act as link people for different students who have individual needs.

They check in with these individuals on a regular basis to monitor their needs and to ensure the appropriate supports are in place.



# Extra Curricular

## Basketball

Presentation Wexford enter four teams in the Basketball Ireland competitions, senior, under 16, first year and second year. We have won numerous southeast league titles over the past few years. Last year, we qualified out of the region at u16 level and reached the All-Ireland quarter final in the National Basketball Arena, Dublin, which was a great achievement and honour for everyone involved.

## Soccer

We have had great success recently. Our 1st years having success in the Leinster Shield final in 2022 to our U-17 team winning the Leinster A League final in 2024 with many of the same team narrowly missing out on winning an All-Ireland Final in 2023. Dedicated students & coaches have provided a positive environment vital to the school's success.

## Students Across the Globe

The group meet regularly & organise a wonderful Multicultural Day. The students work to represent Multiculturalism in the school. In 2023 the school was awarded Champion School of Sanctuary status which is a huge honour. The group aim to create a warm, inclusive & welcoming atmosphere in the school, where all cultures are valued & recognised.

## Equestrian

Competitions are mainly focused on showjumping. There are 2 levels which are based on experience level rather than age. Novice competitions are over an 80cm showjumping track with the open competition over a 100cm track. Teams consist of 4 members with the best 3 scores to count. Students need their own horse or pony and mode of transport to shows

## Swimming

Our swim team includes all students who can swim two lengths of the pool or are members of a swimming club. They compete at the Leinster Senior School competition individually and in relays. In 2024, we were one of the biggest teams of non-club swimmers at the Leinster competition and we finished 8th out of 80 girls schools.

## Badminton

Held every Friday 1 from 3-4 PM offers a fantastic opportunity for students to engage in social badminton, fostering both physical fitness and camaraderie. Whether you're a seasoned player or a beginner, the Badminton Club welcomes everyone to join in the fun and improve their skills in a supportive environment.

## Choir

Rehearsals are held both after school and during lunchtimes, offering students flexible options to participate. The choir regularly performs at events across the county, including the esteemed Wexford Opera House. They have collaborated with Nathan Carter, Michael Londra, & Liam Bates, providing students with valuable performance experience.

## Green Schools Committee

Promote environmental awareness & sustainability in our school. Projects include waste reduction, recycling initiatives, & raising awareness about global environmental issues. We have received our 6th Green Flag. They have won two ECO-UNESCO Young Environmentalist Awards.

## Athletics

Our Cross Country and Track & Field teams offer students the opportunity to compete at both local and national levels. We have enjoyed success in recent years with students earning medals at county, provincial and national events. A number of our athletes have also had the honour of representing Ireland internationally, a testament to their hard work and dedication.

## Science Club

Members explore any area of science within the curriculum or outside. Weekly experiments and demonstrations led by the students in any area of science. Students have an opportunity to prepare projects for Sci. Fest or Young Scientist.

# Extra Curricular

## Debate Club

Students develop their skills of argument & persuasion. The club meets each week in room 2 with Mr Sultana as our Debates mentor. In the club we look at a range of topics including child poverty and climate change. We spend time researching our topics and then work together to form coherent arguments and informed counterpoints. We have recently been approved as a Concern Worldwide Debates competition school.

## Gaelic Football

Gaelic Football is an extremely popular extra curricular activity in Presentation Wexford . With students representing the school 1st yr , U14 , Junior ( U16 ) , TY and Senior ( U19 ) competitions

## Library Club

Our library is a readers for life award recipient. We have a beautiful ,well stocked library of which we are very proud. It is the favourite room in the school for many of our students. Our library is run by a team of 20 student leaders who meet regularly to organise events. Our library places a strong emphasis on writing initiatives and Presentation has a vibrant writing community. Writing for competitions, local & national is encouraged and facilitated through out the year.

## Rugby

We have a junior & senior team. The juniors reached a Leinster final. Our Junior Team won the Leinster final in 2023. Then, they progressed to the National Finals. Here, they came up against some of the giants of school rugby. However, the team's biggest achievement is introducing new players to the game of Rugby

## Board Games Club

The club offers students a unique opportunity to engage in social interaction, critical thinking and teamwork outside of the traditional classroom setting. By participating in this club, students can develop essential skills such as strategic planning, problem-solving and effective communication while enjoying a variety of games.

## Camogie

We have a rich history in Camogie competing at Leinster & All Ireland level. We have teams competing in 1st year, minor (1st and 2nd year), junior (u16 1/2) and senior (u19) competitions. We compete at A & B level, reaching and winning numerous Leinster and All Ireland finals in the last 10 years. We also compete in the Gort 9's invitational, winning it in 2024. Trips have been to New York & upcoming to Dubai.

## Feminist Society

Femsoc provides our senior students with a safe space to discuss issues affecting both their age group and the wider world. Topics discussed include female empowerment, politics and equality for all. Students in FemSoc also fundraise and donate to worthy causes.

## SVP

By participating in this school club, students learn the importance of empathy, social responsibility, and the impact of charitable work on their local community. Involvement in the St. Vincent de Paul Charity group allows students to develop leadership skills, collaborate with peers, and organize fundraising events or volunteer activities, fostering a sense of teamwork and accomplishment.


## Learning Hub

The Learning Hub is a group for students who are curious about and want to be active in all areas of their education. The group organises teach-meets on extra curricular topics of interest, study skills, exam skills, positive mental health and well-being activities. The Learning Hub also fosters relationships with like minded students and schools around the country with visits to other schools as well as hosting other schools who want to know about the Learning Hub.

## Drama

All students in all years are welcome in Drama club. We develop our performance skills and confidence through a variety of games and improvisation activities. Some weeks are experimental and fun, other weeks we work to practise our presentation and performance skills through short scripts or devised pieces. No experience is necessary, the main objective is fun.

# 1st Year Induction



## Tutor Class

In First-Year, we try to ensure that students have as much stability as possible. As may have been the case in primary school, students will have a "base class" group, with whom they may have up to 75% of their classes with. This provides an ideal opportunity for them to get to know each other. In First-Year, students are assigned to mixed ability classes on the basis of their subject choices

## Year Head

Each year group has a Year Head, this is a member of our teaching staff who has overall responsibility for the year group. Year Heads deal with pastoral and behaviour issues in the year and have a great deal of contact with the students. Year Heads also work closely with the school's Attendance and Punctuality Officer.

## The Meitheal-Mentor Scheme

We have a student mentoring programme in Presentation Secondary School, Wexford. Sixth Year Meitheal Leaders are assigned to each First-Year base-class. They meet First-Year students before class begins and at break and lunchtimes in an informal way, which helps to support our new students in the new school community. They also help with transition issues.

## The Class Tutor

Each base class has a Class Tutor – this is a member of our teaching staff who will meet them, for 10 minutes, every morning for Tutor Time, which takes place immediately after the morning break. This constant contact means that new students have someone in the school with whom they have contact with each day and to whom they can talk with if there is any problem with which they need help.

## Induction Days

First-Year students will have their own Induction Days when they join the school in late August. These days are important orientation days for the students, which gives them a chance to get to know their classmates, their Meitheal Leaders and some of the teachers better before formal classes begin.


## Student Council

Wriggle is now providing an improved home delivery model where the student will receive their Wriggle bundle (iPad device/case) to their home (or designated address) over the summer period.

The student device will still be configured and personalised, as well as having a safe and secure management profile setup.


Each bundle will arrive with an easy to navigate 'Get Started Guide' that will include details of how the device is configured (This will be a combination of both physical and online video guides). All that will remain for the student to do is turn it on and insert a passcode (which will be addressed as one of the steps in the 'Get Started Guide').
