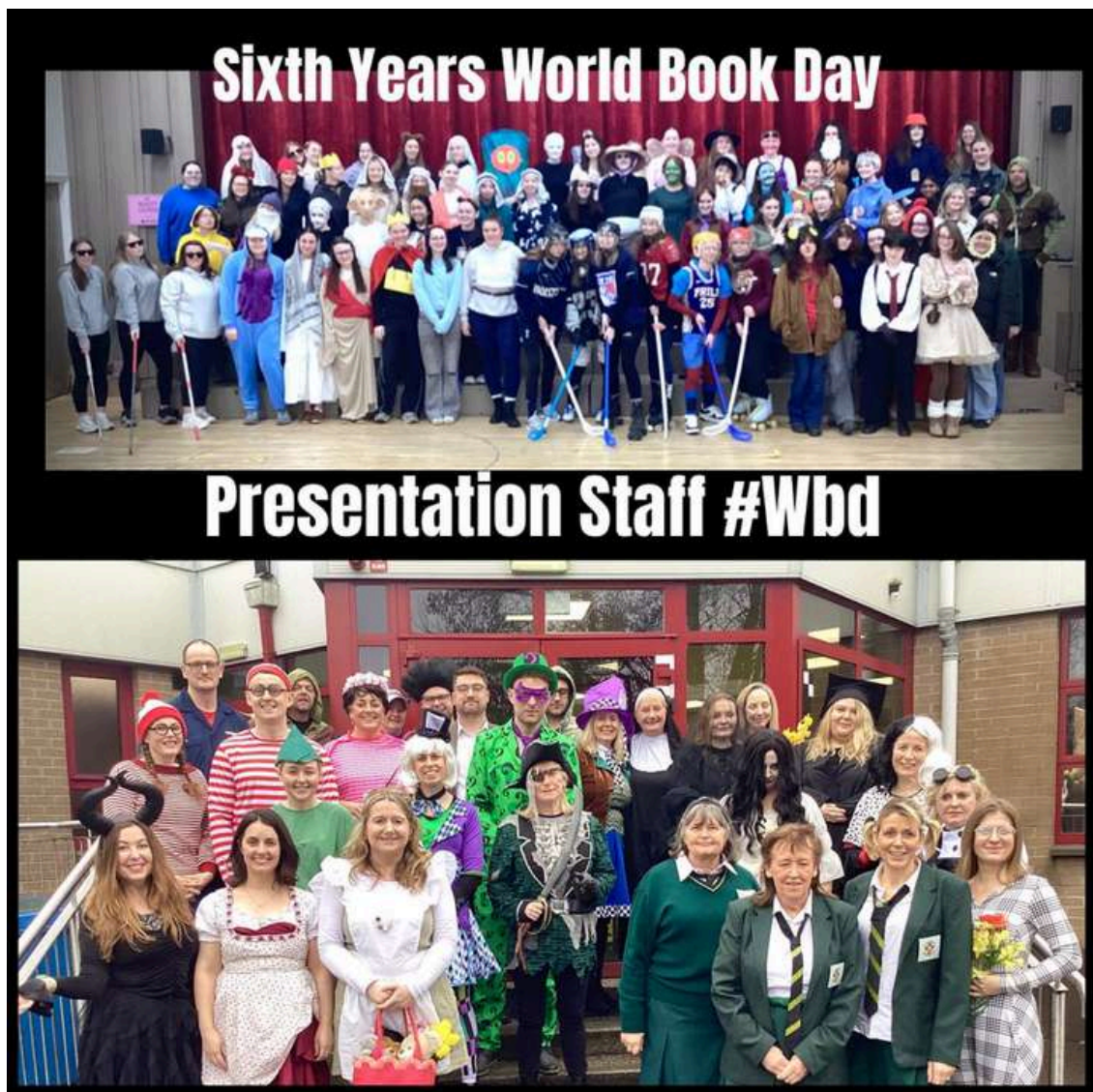

Careers Evening Welcomes Colleges and Professionals

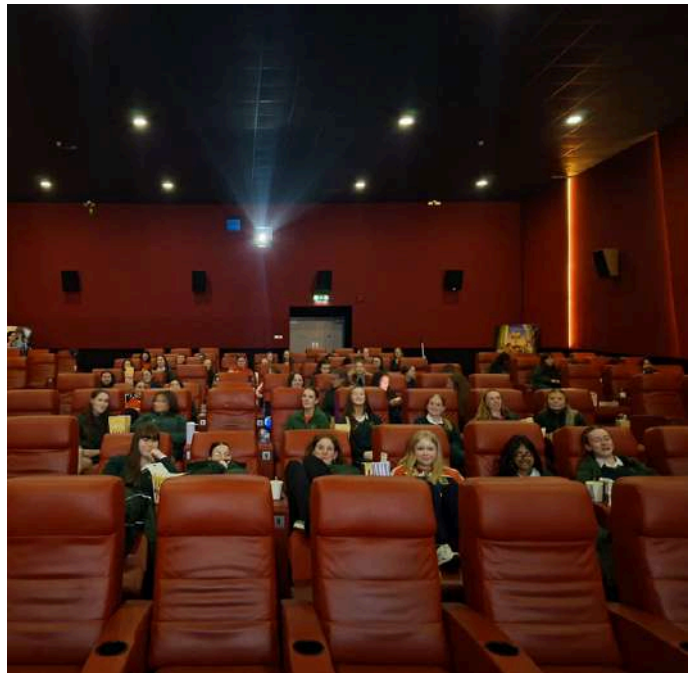
Our school opened its doors this term to a wide range of colleges, universities, and career professionals as the Guidance Department hosted a vibrant and informative Careers Evening.

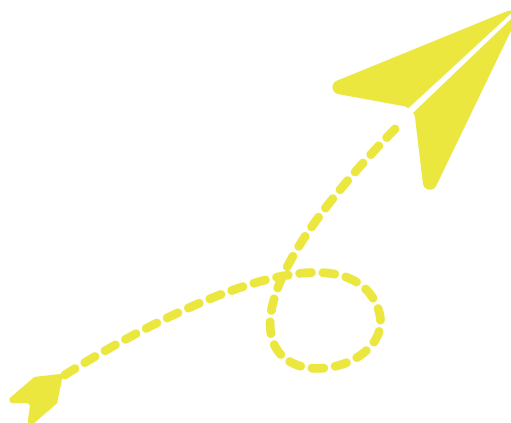
A Heartfelt Thank You from the Editor
